

South Dakota Core Knowledge and Competencies for Early Childhood and School-Age Educators



Are you an educator who is looking to continue to grow as a professional?

The South Dakota Core Knowledge and Competencies (CKCs) represents a core body of knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions all early childhood and school-age care educators must demonstrate to effectively support the development, learning, and wellbeing of young children and school-age youth.

The SD CKCs guide self-reflection and professional growth by describing what early childhood and school-age care educators need to know, understand, and be able to do at all levels of professional practice. The intent is for any individual, regardless of their background or professional status, to view their placement on the continuum of competency, set goals, and work toward improvement.



South Dakota's Core Competencies are divided into eight areas of knowledge and skills. The areas identify the knowledge and skills needed for early childhood educators to work with young children, families, community resources, and other professionals. The eight domain areas are:

- 1. Health, Safety, and Nutrition
- 2. Child Growth and Development
- 3. Child Guidance and Emotional Well-being
- 4. Learning Environment, Planning, and Curriculum
- 5. Observation, Documentation, and Assessment
- 6. Family, School, and Community **Partnerships**
- 7. Professionalism and Leadership
- 8. Program Administration

The South Dakota Core Knowledge and Competencies is a supportive guide for your learning, understanding, and application and how you choose to invest in YOU! The intent is for any individual to view their placement on the continuum of competency, set goals, and work toward improvement. The SD ECE system has various opportunities for your professional development and is here to support you in your journey as an educator supporting South Dakota children and families.

ADULT/CHILD & INFANT CPR/AED TRAINING ONLINE OPTION

Providers have an option to complete the education portion online and conduct face to face skill testing in Aberdeen or Sioux Falls.

Below is the process to conduct the education portion online and face to face skill testing:

- Contact our office to receive online CPR course link information.
- Complete the online course. After completion of the online course, you will have 60 days to complete the face-to-face skill testing portion.
- Contact our office to schedule 1:1 skill testing. Certificate of completion of online course must be brought to skill testing.

NEWS FROM THE SIOUX FALLS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

City Ordinance section 92.181 (b) stipulates that "a provider may care for a maximum of 12 children, including the provider's own children who are under the age of six years. No more than four of the 12 children may be under the age of two years, and no more than two of these four children may be under the age of one to maintain an adult child ratio of one adult to four children for children under the age of two."

Due to recent changes to ratio allowances by South Dakota Department of Social Services and their licensing of Family Day Cares, we want to remind all in-home day care providers that operate within the city limits of Sioux Falls that the **requirements of city ordinance** must be followed.
